## NISQUALLY INDIAN TRIBE EMERGENCY REGULATION 4-2024/2025

July 29, 2024

In accordance with Section 14.23.02 of Nisqually Tribal Code, Title 14-Chapter 2, as amended by the Tribal Council effective 7/1/91, the Nisqually Fish Commission has adopted the following fishery modification effective August 11, 2024 for the Nisqually River 83D.

Area: Nisqually River mouth to downstream of Clear Creek at Flagging. 83D

Gill Net Days and hours open:

Nighttime Closure – Closed 10 p.m. to 1 hour before Sunrise

August

11, 12, 13, 14 Sunday noon to Wednesday noon

August

18, 19, 20, 21 Sunday noon to Wednesday noon

August

25, 26, 27 Sunday noon to Tuesday noon

September 1, 2, 3

Sunday noon to Tuesday noon

## Nisqually Commercial Regulations as defined by 2024 Annual Regulations:

- 1. Commercial and C+S Fisheries -Any combination of 2 gill nets <u>per</u> active fisher combined cannot exceed 250 feet in length. No singular set net can exceed 125 feet in length. No drift gill net can exceed 70 feet in length.
- 2. No net shall extend beyond 1/3 the width of the channel of the Nisqually River at any tide.
- 3. All nets shall be clearly identified with **NISQ and fishing ID number** with letters no less than 1" in height. Buoys from recycled jugs from nontoxic products only.
- 4. <u>All nets can be tended only by owner and or authorized assistant-"active fisher".</u> Gill nets shall be tended not less than once every 24 hours.
- 5. Fishing locations in freshwater areas shall be not less than 250 feet apart.
- 6. It is the fisherman's responsibility to check the actual Emergency Regulation, by calling the Natural Resource Department 360-456-5221 ext 2133 or Dave Blanksma at 556-6776 or 701-6696.
